

Halcombe School (2362)

Enrolment Scheme

The guidelines for the development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live in the home zone described below and/or shown in the attached map shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

In a clockwise direction, the zone is defined as:

- The zone begins at the intersection of Te Rakehou Road and Halcombe Road and connects in a north westerly direction with Mt Stewart Halcombe Road #818.
- The boundary proceeds in a north west, then northerly direction to #210 Mingaroa Road.
- The boundary continues north west to the Rangitikei River, then follows the east side of the river to #787 Reu Reu Road (also known as *Potaka Station*).
- The boundary proceeds south and includes both sides of Reu Reu Road to #256 (also commonly known as *Reu Reu Road Extension*).
- The zone then runs in a mainly easterly direction to the end of Awawa Road and includes both sides of Awawa Road to the intersection with Short Road.
- The boundary follows Short Road southwards and includes both sides of Short Road to the intersection with Makino Road.
- The zone includes both sides of Makino Road to the intersection of Brewsters Road (Brewsters road is not in zone), and includes both sides of Bell Road West. Zone includes Koru Court.
- The boundary proceeds west to Lethbridge Road where it crosses at #309. Sherrards Road is not in zone.
- From the Lethbridge Road, the zone goes to the intersection of Te Rakehou and Halcombe Road the starting point.

Proof of residence with the home zone may be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students may be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the school to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulation in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applicants for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

1. First Priority: this priority group is not applicable to Halcombe School because the School does not run any special programmes as approved by the Secretary

2. Second Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
3. Third Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
4. Fourth Priority will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
5. Fifth Priority will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board or a child of a member of the board of the school.
6. Sixth Priority will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups, than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.
